About

This Wellcome Trust-funded Programme was previously open to medical, veterinary, and dental graduates, but we are pleased to announce that it is now open to **ALL** health professionals who are registered with a UK regulatory body. Successful applicants will undertake outstanding PhD training within a cohort of clinical fellows across the GW4 universities and provide a choice of joining one of over 50 world-leading research groups. The nature of your biomedical research question will determine the expertise and methodology available to you across a wide range of core and specialist training modules to support your ambitions, plus exceptional individualised mentoring, and wellbeing support.

PhD projects and supervisors are **not expected** to be in place before applying for a place and will be prepared during the pre-PhD period with expert guidance.

Funding

Clinical salary, PhD fees, project consumables, some training and travel costs for the duration of the PhD.

Eligibility

This opportunity is aimed at exceptionally motivated qualified health professionals who are at an early stage of their career, but who can demonstrate the capability and drive to undertake a period of research with a view to developing a long-term career as a clinical academic within their specialty.

Applicants must be fully qualified health professionals (for full list see <u>here</u>) with a qualification to practice clinically in the UK and be fully registered with a Professional Regulatory Body within the UK/RoI.
